I did not really plan it but my forte was going into schools that were struggling and helping them to win. Over the years we moved more than I wish we had (it was never because I was asked to leave). A big part of that was for money or a perceived advancement in earlier years, then going in and out of Texas wanting to get a Head football job there. After retirement we have kind of tried to meet the needs of family or a ministry.

We have kids all over the Midwest so I retired from Washington and moved to Nebraska where I got to coach my grandson. I enjoyed being offensive coordinator and coaching sprints and hurdles in track, as well as substitute teaching for seven years before migrating to Texas after Hurricane Harvey to help with cleanup and to help start a church. During that time I continued to coach football and substitute teach in Corpus Christi. During the pandemic we moved back to Nebraska to be closer to family and where I have again helped at the school.

Walter Kronkite was 89 when he passed. Before that he said that if he had known he would live so long he would not have retired so young – he retired at 74. I can identify completely with that logic so now am ready to go again – whether this year or next – I have a calling.

**ACTIVITIES:** School - Class and student body officer, plays, yearbook editor, Choir & Band, 3 sports.

Adult – Lion’s Club, Volunteer with Boy Scouts & 4H, Church and FCA, Coach of the Year several times, and selected to the Camas High School Hall of Fame after their State Championship in football where we had “paved the road”. 2018 – 2020 Corpus Christi, Texas substitute teaching and assisting in coaching.

2011-2018 Coaching football and track and substitute teaching at Chase County School in Imperial, Ne. Was able to coach a grandson and won several District Championships in both football and track.

Assistant Football and Head Track while teaching Geography.

Team won the District in Track and we had a State Champion in the 800 meter (by a kid that I had to talk into giving up another event to “try” the 800 – and that was what got him a scholarship.) One of my strengths is discernment – to help people in the position or event where they can be most successful.

Athletic Director, Head Football & Track, Taught History We had two playoff teams in football and regional track team runner up the third year after I started the track program at the school.

- 1989-1991 Washington High School, Tacoma, Washington 900  
Head Football, Assistant Track. Taught both PE and History. District Champions and State quarterfinals both years – first winning seasons in the school’s 20 year history. State track champions.
- 1988-1989 LaJoya High School, LaJoya, Texas 2100  
Assistant Football & Head Track. History Teacher
- 1985-1988 Labette County High School, Altamont, Kansas 600  
Assistant Athletic Director, Head Football, Assistant Track, History Teacher. Won the League and first district games in school history (17 seasons after state playoffs started)

Assistant Football, Head Track, History Teacher. Quarterfinals in football, 2<sup>nd</sup> in District in Track.

Won the District and in playoffs twice (the only times since the school opened in 1969). Also won Regional Track two times and 3<sup>rd</sup> in State. Basketball team went to state one year.
- 1979-1980 Sales work for an insurance company and school fundraiser. Did not coach. Made money to ‘catch up’ after my private school years – but not my calling. Also acted as interim pastor in a church.
- 1971-1979 Salem Academy, Salem, Oregon 300  
Head Football, Head Track, Assistant Basketball, Athletic Director, History and PE Teacher.  
Won Regional track 5 times. Football was runner up or 3<sup>rd</sup> in State four of these years. Basketball team was in the State Tournament two times.
- 1969-1971 Carmen-Dacoma High School, Carmen, Oklahoma 115  
Head 8 man football, Head Track, Assistant Basketball, Athletic Director, History and PE Teacher.  
Started the track program – won the league and had a state champion, also went to state in basketball, and was 2<sup>nd</sup> in District in football.

Head Football, Assistant Basketball, Head Track, History Teacher. No playoffs in Kansas then but we would have qualified in Football.
